Human rights are taken for granted in Europe, and among Europe's citizens. This was not always so. There were long battles to achieve such rights, and then to see Europe's Human Rights Act established, enacted and enforced. Now, the current crisis has helped to refocus our interest in civic, political and economic rights by challenging universalism and revealing gaps and inequalities. This summer school – the 20th in our series – will bring together experts from law and justice, think tanks, NGOs and universities, to discuss key questions over five days of talks, panels, working groups, debates role-playing and discussions.
