Level required: English B1 and/or Italian A2 based upon the Common European Framework of Reference. Nursing degree programme requires a level of Italian B1. Postgraduate programmes taught in English require level B2. An official certification in English or Italian is not required.

## Credits & Workload

### ECTS (European Credit Transfer System)

Bachelor's degree: 3 years of study (6 semesters) with the total of 180 ECTS.

Master's degree: 2 years of study (4 semesters) with the total of 120 ECTS.

Full time workload per semester: 30 ECTS

Please note: 1 ECTS credits are based on 25 Student Work Hours, which are not only the hours of work in class but also an extensive amount of work outside the classroom.

# Lectures Attendance and Exams

**Lecture attendance is not compulsory but is strongly recommended.** Students must sit exams in person during the official exam session, no supplementary sessions for exchange students are foreseen.

## Registration Procedure

**After nomination, you receive a first e-mail message** ("Acceptance message") inviting you to complete your online registration: you must upload a .JPG file with a photo of your face. You can also upload your Learning Agreement.

**When you have completed your registration, you will automatically receive a second message** ("Confirmation of registration") containing the name of your exchange coordinator (only for Erasmus + mobility) and your username and password. Remember: this password is required to connect to all Unibo online resources. You will need this password to log into all Unibo online resources. Check your studio unibo account "@studio.unibo.it" frequently, because all communications of the University of Bologna are sent only to the address "@studio.unibo.it". **You will be able to connect to online services only after the check-in**

## Italian Tax Code

Italian Tax Code (codice fiscale) is mandatory for several activities such as to open an Italian bank account, to sign a lease contract for a flat, to buy a mobile phone number, to apply for a utility connection.

Fiscal code is mandatory for Nursing and Radiology students.

# Visa and rules for residence in Italy

Non-EU exchange students, wishing to stay in Italy for longer than 90 days, must pre-enrol and apply for entry visa for study purposes at this link [Visa to enter Italy](#).

**Important:** you must apply for a visa for "Studies –Exchange and Mobility Programme".

To apply for a visa you must:

- pre-enrol online via the University portal.  
**Important! check this link for more information**
- As soon as you arrive in Rimini you must check-in at the International Relations Office before filling in the application for the residence permit
- When delivering the kit to the post office, you will receive an appointment at the immigration office

Send the receipt of the post office and then the residence permit s as soon as available to the International Relations Office. If you forget it, after 150 days from the Check-in, you won't be allowed to sit exams.

If you are a non-EU student, but you fall into the following situation:

- you are enrolled at a university in the European Union (Schengen Area) and
- you have a residence permit for study purposes issued in a member country of the European Union (Schengen Area) which covers the entire mobility period and which is renewable in the country where it was issued and
- you participate in a European mobility programme or you carry out a mobility under an international agreement.

you must check, at the Visa Office of the Embassy of Italy in your country, where you currently live and study, if you are exempted from a visa. It is recommended to have a written reply (e-mail) from the Visa Office. In this case, upon arrival you must fill in the declaration of presence and you don't have to apply for a residence permit.

Online registration for oral exams and assessment is compulsory.

Through Almaesami you will be able to register only for the courses already included in your online study plan and you can also check whether your grades have been recorded.

Earlier or extra assessments for exchange students cannot be arranged. Exchange students need to sit the exams on the official examination dates. Examination dates vary between the UNIBO departments but generally take place between January and February (winter term) and between June and July (summer term).

# Grading System

All degree programmes have a credit and modular structure.

Students are expected to study units ( “moduli” ) in order to get enough credits.

# Italian Language Course

## CLA – Language Centre of the Rimini Campus

CLA offers free Italian language course to all exchange and international students.

**Address:** Via Angherà, 22 -Second floor, Rimini

Italian language courses are worth 5 ECTS. In order to award the 5 ECTS credits, students must attend at least 70% of the lessons and pass the final test.

### To enroll in an Italian course you must:

- Enroll by the deadline
- Take the online test
- Register online for an interview, choosing the day and time.
- Take the interview online

### Registration online is mandatory

It is important to apply as soon as the application procedure opens due to a limited number of places.

Application dates and deadline will be sent by email or can be checked on the website.

The one-semester courses are offered in presence and online over approximately 13 weeks (October-December and February-May).

Course length: 50 hours (40 hours in class + 10 e-learning), 2 hours per day, 2 days per week.

In Rimini, these courses are offered at two levels:

- A2 – elementary
- B1 – intermediate

# Accommodation and Cost of Living

Most of students in Rimini live in shared private flats. Monthly rates range from 250 to 450 euro.

Students at Rimini Campus who wish to register their rental lease or to take over the lease from another student can ask a Revenue Advisor for help. If required, ask the IRO office for more information.

If you might prefer to see available solutions before renting a flat or a room, we suggest booking a temporary accommodation for your first days in Rimini.

You may find on web many hostels, which are convenient to Erasmus students and small hotels or apartment hotels offering rooms at affordable rates.

# Health Care

The Italian National Health Service is called “Servizio Sanitario Nazionale” (SSN) and is divided into local Healthcare Boards (Aziende Unità Sanitarie Locali – AUSL)

## EU Citizens

If you are an EU citizen, you must bring your European Health Insurance Card - EHIC (TEAM in Italy) in order to have access to medical care. You can go directly to a General Practitioner, also called family doctor with your card.

All the costs are charged directly to your insurance company. If you have not been able to use your European Health Insurance Card, when you go back, check if you can get a refund of the health expenses from your insurance company. It is important to keep payment receipts and health records.

For some specialist services, the payment of a “free ticket” is required as a contribution to cover part of the costs. For dental care, the national health system provides only diagnostic and urgent treatment.

## Non-EU Citizens:

Registration with the Italian National Health Service (SSN)

If you are a non-EU citizen you have access to the National Health Service only after paying an annual registration fee of € 149,77.

## Private health insurance

You have a private health insurance valid in Italy and covering the risk of illness, accident, maternity.

You can purchase a health insurance policy from various private companies.

# Health Care

If you have a private health insurance (purchased in Italy or in your own country) you may go to any General Practitioner, choosing one from the list of doctors published on the website.

If you need a specialist treatment, you can choose any doctor, also on the advice of your chosen GP. You must pay for the visits and then apply to your insurance company for a refund. It is recommended to check in advanced, by contacting your insurance company, if the specific treatment can be refunded.

The toll-free number of the Regional Health Service is 800 033 033 (Numero verde). It is a free telephone information service which provides you with all the information about health services and assistance in Emilia-Romagna.

# How to reach Rimini?

## BY PLANE

Rimini is easy to reach, it depends in which airport you are going to land.  
The main airports are the following ones:

### **RIMINI – FEDERICO FELLINI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (8 km)**

Direct bus to the central train station of Rimini (number 9).

### **BOLOGNA AIRPORT G. Marconi (120 km)**

- Directly by bus from the airport to Rimini. Shuttle Rimini Bologna airport. (130min)
- Bus to Bologna train station + train to Rimini: Bologna Central train station is 6 km away from the airport and it is served by a regular shuttle connection. (30 min)
- Marconi Express: direct train connection to the train station (10 min). Trains from Bologna to Rimini have the direction Ancona and the journey lasts 120min.

# How To Reach Rimini by train

Rimini has one central station located in Piazzale Cesare Battisti,<sup>1</sup> and four minor ones (Miramare, Viserba, Torre Pedrera, Rimini Fiera).

The central one is "Rimini" and trains arriving from Bologna, Bari, Venice, Ravenna stop here.

The connections are provided by regional and fast trains, joining Turin and Milan, with the Adriatic Coast (Rimini, Ancona, Pescara, Foggia, Bari, Lecce and Taranto). For the Train Timetable see the official website [www.trenitalia.com](http://www.trenitalia.com)
