

Required documentation for international students to apply for ER.GO benefits

International students must provide documentation relating to their economic situation and assets as issued by the authorities in the place where the income was produced and the assets possessed.

The documentation must be translated into Italian and legalised by the Italian diplomatic authorities in the place of origin or, where this is required, apostilled according to applicable regulations. In countries where it is particularly difficult to obtain certificates vetted by the local Italian embassy, the documents may be substituted by a certificate in Italian issued by the Embassy or Consulate of the home country in Italy, legalised by the local branch of the Home Office (Prefettura).

In all cases, the documentation must indicate:

- a) the composition of the household, a certificate attesting to the composition of the household
 - in the event of divorced parents: students shall submit the divorce deed or court document if there is an ongoing separation;
 - in the event of death: students shall submit a death certificate if not already submitted in previous academic years;
 - if the father has not acknowledged parenthood of the student: students shall submit a birth certificate;
 - if the student is a full orphan: students shall submit the death certificates of both parents if not already submitted in previous academic years;
- b) certification of the income earned in the year 2022 by all members of the household who are of age, issued by the competent public administration and showing their total gross income from work or pensions. In cases where some members do not carry out any work activity, the documentation must show their non-employment or unemployment status and the amount of any unemployment benefit or similar received;
- c) certification of all the buildings owned on 31 December 2022 by each household member with an indication of the surface area in square metres.
 - In all other cases (rental agreement, free use, etc.), a declaration issued by the competent authorities stating that no member of the household owns property must be attached. Other buildings: the relevant certificates of ownership must be submitted;
- d) any residual mortgage sum as of 31/12/2022 for the home and/or other property;
- e) the value of the real estate owned by each individual household member as of 31/12/2022.
