Each position is reserved to one of the two curricula of the PhD programme. Please, note that for each Curriculum a specific sub-ranking list will be drawn up. Positions with scholarship will be awarded on the basis of the Curriculum selected by applicants during the application stage and indicated in the cover page of the research project proposal. In the event that the applicant has not designated the preferred Curriculum as described above, the Admission Board will assign him/her the most appropriate curriculum based on the research project submitted.

Should available positions relating to one of the two curricula remain vacant, eligible applicants from the ranking list relating to the other curriculum may be contacted. The remaining available positions shall be awarded from the top of the other curriculum ranking list downward.

Positions linked to specific research subjects: during the oral test, applicants may express to the Admission Board their interest in the position linked to a specific research subject. Considering the expressions of interest above, the Admission Board will establish if the applicants can be considered eligible for the allocation of the position linked to a specific research subject, taking into account their skills, experience and aptitude. The position with scholarship linked to a specific research subject will be awarded on the basis of the eligibility stated by the Admission Board. Should the abovementioned position remain vacant, eligible applicants from the general ranking list may be contacted.

Further qualifications that may be attached to the application, if in possession of the applicant (only qualifications attested by documents drawn up in Italian, English, French, German and Spanish shall be considered as valid and assessed by the Admission Board)

- No more than 2 reference letters signed by Italian and international academics and professionals in the research field, which do not form part of the Admission Board, attesting the suitability of the applicant and his/her interest for the scientific research.
Please, note that the above letters cannot be uploaded by applicants. When filling the online application form on <http://studenti.unibo.it>, applicants will be only allowed to provide the email accounts of the requested academic/professional. The latter shall receive an email from the University of Bologna providing for the instructions for uploading. Only letters in pdf format submitted before the expiry date and time of the Call shall be accepted.

- Multi-annual research project, with special emphasis on the activities to be completed during the first-year course. The proposal must meet the following requirements:
 - o It must indicate in the cover page the Curriculum/research topic of the PhD Programme covered by the research project proposal and for which the applicant is applying.
 - o It must include: scientific basis; targets; assumptions; methodology/articulation of the study/studies (sample, independent and dependent variables, results analysis plan, theoretical and practical implications, project development timeline). It cannot exceed 3.000 words – references not included.
 The research projects that successful applicants shall carry out during their doctoral career may possibly differ from the project proposed at the application stage. This shall be defined together with the supervisor and approved by the Academic Board.
- Motivation letter. This must include the reasons prompting the applicant to attend the PhD Programme and those relevant experiences and research interests, that make the applicant suitable for the specific PhD Programme (3000 characters maximum, including spaces).
- List of the publications (monographs, articles published on scientific journals, volume chapters).

Evaluation criteria

Points will be allocated to applications out of a total of 100 on the basis of the following weighting:

1. Qualifications and research project

- Minimum for admission to the oral exam: 30 points
- Maximum: 50 points

Only qualifications relating to the last 5 calendar years prior to the calendar year of publication of the Call for applications shall be taken into consideration, with the exception of the University Degree (Diploma di laurea). Please, note that qualifications must be consistent with the PhD Programme.

Points relating to qualifications shall be allocated on the basis of the following criteria:

- Graduation final mark. Undergraduates shall be evaluated on the basis of the Weighted Average Mark (WAM): max 10 points
- Reference letters: max 2 point
- Motivation Letter: max 1 point
- Publications: max 4 points

Points relating to the research project shall be allocated on the basis of the following criteria:

- Scientific value and ground-breaking nature of the proposal: max 13 points
- Description and structure of the proposal: max 10 points
- Proposal feasibility: max 10 points

2. Oral examination

- Minimum for inclusion in the final ranking list :30 points
- Maximum: 50 points

Oral examination includes the presentation of the research project and is intended to assess the suitability of the applicant in respect of the pursuing of scientific research as well as the general knowledge of issues connected to the PhD Programme.

The oral examination is carried out in English.

Points relating to the oral examination shall be allocated on the basis of the following criteria:

- Knowledge of English language: max 10 points
- Research project presentation: max 35 points
- General knowledge of issues connected to the PhD Programme: max 5 points
