Project description	The project involves the study and enhancement of a case of circular economy, in an intergenerational perspective of action-research, initiated by the association Recupero Solidale (Re.So.) in Empoli that deals with recovering unsold food and non-food products and redistribute them to families in need. Since 2004 Re.So. has created a large community of practice through initiatives aimed at enhancing the human and social capital of those categories considered fragile and non-productive (pensioners, unemployed, convicts). For this reason, Re.So. has been chosen as a virtuous case within the Interreg Eure program on behalf of the joint stock company Asev.

Project title	Local communities and sustainable tourism: strategies of resilience and prevention of the environmental risk in Italian marginal mountain areas
Project description	Italian marginal mountain areas characterized by economic and demographic decline, and by related environmental problems, have been for years at the core of relevant academic and institutional debates, as evidenced by the attention paid to these territories by the PNRR. The project intends to radically rethink the idea of local community in order to propose it as an inclusive concept associated with the collective experience of sharing everyday spatial practices in specifically vulnerable places. Sustainable tourism, if conceived in ways that may facilitate and enhance the protection of the environmental and the resilience of the local community, may become a strategic tool for the prevention of environmental risk in some of these fragile territories and for promoting the social and cultural cohesion of communities via the strengthening of the local economy and the provision of new employment opportunities.

Project title	Mass consumption and environmental challenges: a historical approach
Project description	Mass consumption is one of the major forces of largescale ecological change. Yet consumption is viewed as a pillar of economic growth and political stability and consumer cultures are strategic loci of identity politics, cultural appropriations and even emancipatory practices. Thus, consumption illuminate the contradictions we are facing on a planetary level between what could be qualified as the material and cultural advances of modernity and their catastrophic ecological consequences. Within this framework the Phd candidate will be asked to present a research project on the narratives and marketing strategies promoted by companies of the private sector aimed at negotiating consumption growth and environmental sustainability since the 1970s.

Project description	The project examines, in different historical and geographical contexts, the reflection developed by women on technologies (productive and reproductive, information and communication technology, digital innovation), their social dimension, their emancipatory potential. The aim is to investigate the innovations introduced by the feminist political discourse in the understanding and design of new technologies, in the light of their tension to reproduce or transform inequalities and gendered forms of oppression.
