## Required and Supporting Documents to be attached to the application

All the documents listed below **shall be drawn up in English**. In case of documents originally issued in any other language (e.g. identity document, qualifications), an official English translation is required.

Only qualifications obtained **during the last 5 calendar years** shall be taken into consideration, except for the University Degree. The Admission Board will assess the relevance of the supporting documents to the PhD Programme.

<b>Identity document</b>	Valid identity document with photo (i.e. identity card, passport)
<b>Curriculum Vitae</b>	CV must be written in English
<b>Qualifications</b>	Documents attesting the awarding of the first and second cycle degrees, the exams taken and the marks obtained (see Art. 3 of the Call for Applications)
<b>Multi-annual research proposal</b>	A multi-annual research proposal, <b>in English only</b> , with special emphasis on the activities to be completed during the first-year course. The research proposal shall meet the following requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- it shall indicate <b>on the cover page the research topic</b> covered by the research proposal and for which the applicant is applying;</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- it <b>cannot exceed 4.000 words</b>, including spaces and formula possibly used. This figure does not include: the title of the proposal, the outline, references and images (such as graphs, diagrams, tables etc. - where present);</li> <li>- <b>it must include</b>: the state of the art; description of the proposal; expected results; lead-time for implementation; references.</li> </ul> <p>The research proposal that successful applicants shall carry out during their doctoral career may possibly differ from the proposal presented at the application stage. This shall be defined together with the supervisor and approved by the Academic Board.</p>
<b>SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS</b>	
<b>Thesis abstract</b>	Abstract of the <b>second cycle degree thesis</b> . Graduands may submit an abstract of the thesis to be defended. Abstracts cannot exceed 5.000 characters, including spaces and formulas, if present. The above figure does not include: title, outline, images such as graphs, diagrams, tables etc. if present – <b>In English only</b> .
<b>Personal Statement</b>	The statement shall include the reasons prompting the applicant to attend the PhD Programme and those relevant experiences and research interests, that make the applicant suitable for the specific PhD Programme (2000 characters maximum, including spaces) – <b>In English only</b> .
<b>Reference letter/s</b>	<b>No more than 2 reference letters</b> signed by Italian and/or international academics and professionals in the research field, which do not form part of the Admission Board, attesting the suitability of the applicant and his/her interest for the scientific research. For more information about the specific uploading procedure, see the Call for Applications (Art. 3.2) – <b>In English only</b> (the applicants must inform the academics/professionals about the required language)
<b>Publications</b>	List of publications (i.e. monographs, articles on scientific journals, volume chapters) and minor publications (conference papers, etc.) – <b>In English only</b>

Scores will be expressed in points out of 100, as follows.

1. **Qualifications and research proposal evaluation** - minimum score for admission to the oral examination: 30 points, maximum score: 50 points

<b>Qualifications evaluation</b>	Graduation final mark. Graduands shall be evaluated on the basis of the Weighted Average Mark (WAM)	<b>7 points max</b> , awarded as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 7 points corresponding to 110 with honors</li> <li>- 5 points from 110 to 105</li> <li>- 3 points from 104 to 100</li> <li>- 0 points if the final mark is less than 100</li> </ul> <p>For graduands, Weighted Average Mark (WAM) evaluation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 30 = 7 points</li> <li>- 29 = 5 points</li> <li>- 28 = 3 points</li> <li>- less than 28 = 0 points</li> </ul>
