Internship or project work and final examination	The course is completed through an "internship" or "project work" activity of 300 hours for 12 CFU. The "internship" implies collaboration with a local authority, company, association, etc. in the Burgundy or Emilia-Romagna area available to offer an internship to one or more candidates, with the aim of enhancing practical experience for learning purposes and encouraging the building of networks in the professional world. An alternative to the "internship", the "project work" consists of individual research work on a specific topic addressed during the course and of particular interest to the candidate, to be explored in depth under the supervision of a course teacher and possibly an external supervisor identified in the world of work.

description: outcomes/targets	Education, University and Research, for academic year 2024/2025, Alma Mater Studiorum – Università di Bologna, Administrative office of Bologna, will run a 2°-level Professional Master's Programme in "Transitions and Innovations in the European Territory: Environments and Landscapes Beyond the Anthropocene".
	The Professional Master's Programme has been set up on the proposal of the Department of Cultural Heritage and in cooperation with Fondazione Flaminia, and organized in collaboration with Collège Européen de Cluny.
	The master's aim is to provide the skills and knowledge necessary for the design and management of territorial innovation projects in Europe, focusing in particular on the management of common goods in the context of ongoing climate and environmental transformations, adopting as a unifying theme the concept of "landscape".
	The course contributes to training a professional figure of "project manager in territorial innovation", called to carry out functions both in local, regional, national, or European authorities, and in consultancy companies for local authorities, or within service operators of public interest.
Qualifications required for admission	Master's degree or old system (+5 diploma). No specific training is required, holders of any Laurea Magistrale degree or equivalent can have access to the training. Most likely profiles: sociologists,



	geographers, urban planners, architects, engineers, graduates in political science, cultural heritage, international relations or European studies.
