Multi-annual research proposal	<p>A multi-annual research proposal, with special emphasis on the activities to be completed during the first-year course. The research proposal shall meet the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - It shall indicate on the cover page the research topic covered by the research proposal and for which the applicant is applying; - It cannot exceed 20,000 characters, including spaces and formula possibly used. This figure does not include: the title of proposal, the outline, references and images (such as graphs, diagrams, tables etc - where present); - It must include: the state of the art; description of the proposal; expected results; lead-time for implementation; references. <p>The research proposals that successful applicants shall carry out during their doctoral career may possibly differ from the proposal presented at the application stage. This shall be defined together with the supervisor and approved by the Academic Board.</p>
Thesis abstract	Abstract of the second cycle degree thesis. Graduands may submit the draft of their thesis (abstracts cannot exceed 5,000 characters, including spaces and formulas, if present. The above figure does not include: title, outline, images such as graphs, diagrams, tables etc. if present).
Publications	List of publications (i.e. monographs, articles on scientific journals, volume chapters – max. 3) and minor publications (conference papers, etc. – max. 2), both in full text. Abstracts and posters presented during academic conferences.

** Oral examination includes the presentation of the research proposal and is intended to assess the suitability of the applicant in respect of the pursuing of scientific research as well as the general knowledge of issues encompassed by the PhD Programme ([list at the bottom of the page](#)). During the oral examination, English language proficiency shall be assessed. The oral examination is carried out in one of the languages of the PhD course (Italian, English or French).

Final Ranking List and Enrollment

Considering the expressions of interest for the **topic-specific position** (Art. 9 of the Call for Applications), the Admission Board will establish if the applicants can be considered eligible for the allocation of the said positions, taking into account their skills, experience and aptitude. Topic-specific positions will be awarded according to a sub-ranking list of eligible applicants.

After the publication of the results of the oral examination, the **final ranking list** will be available on the [University website](#), selecting the relevant PhD Programme > "More information", section "Notices" at the bottom of the page.

Following the publication of the final ranking list, successful applicants shall **enroll** on [Studenti Online](#) by the deadline indicated on the [University website](#), selecting the relevant PhD Programme > "More information".

If a successful applicant withdraws from a position, the following applicant in the ranking list, who is also eligible for the specific position, will be contacted. During the replacement procedure, the new terms of enrollment shall be communicated via e-mail to the chosen applicant.

Please, note that PhD candidates with scholarship must carry out their study and research activity on a continuous basis at the premises of the Department of Legal Studies (Curriculum 1 - European Law) and at the premises of the Department of Sociology and Business Law (Curriculum 2 - European Markets Law) of the University of Bologna, with the exception of the study period to be spent abroad as authorized by the Academic Board.
