Charles H. Cho is Professor of Sustainability Accounting and the Erivan K. Haub Chair in Business & Sustainability at the Schulich School of Business, York University. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Accounting, a Master of Science in Accounting, and a PhD in Business Administration (Accounting Track) from the University of Central Florida. He also worked for KPMG LLP and other public accounting firms for several years in auditing and taxation. His research interests include Social and Environmental Accounting; Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR); and Accounting and the Public Interest. Professor Cho has published his work in leading academic journals such as *Accounting, Auditing and Accountability Journal*, *Accounting, Organizations and Society*, *Critical Perspectives on Accounting*, the *European Accounting Review*, and the *Journal of Business Ethics*. He currently serves as an Editor of *Accounting Forum*; the Accounting and Business Ethics Section Co-Editor of the *Journal of Business Ethics*; and as an Associate Editor of *Business & Society*. He is actively involved in the academic community with the Centre for Social and Environmental Accounting Research (former Council member), the European Accounting Association (member of two committees) and the Canadian Academic Accounting Association (member of the Board of Directors) as well as the business community with CPA Ontario (member of the Sustainability Strategic Advisory Committee), the Club Canadien de Toronto (member of the Board of Directors), the French Tech and the AAGEF (French Graduate Schools Alumni Association in Ontario). He is also regularly invited as plenary keynote speaker at international conferences and professional events, and solicited by the media. Recently, he was selected as one of the “Top 50 Academic and Research Support Project” from the Republic of Korea’s Prime Minister and Minister of Education; received the Honorable Knight Award from the University of Central Florida’s Hall of Fame; and was recognized as one of the top 2% most cited scholars within discipline worldwide (34th in the world and 1st in Canada) in the Accounting field for 2022.
