

Enrico Foietta è assegnista di ricerca e professore a contratto per il "Workshop di Archeologia Orientale – 2023/2024" presso l'Università di Torino (UniTO). Ha conseguito un dottorato in archeologia presso UniTO nel 2017, con una ricerca sulla pianificazione urbana e il paesaggio di Hatra (Iraq settentrionale). Ha ottenuto complessivamente sei assegni di ricerca dall'Università degli Studi di Torino. Nel 2018 e nel 2019/2020 ha ottenuto due borse di studio sul paesaggio e l'urbanistica di Seleucia sul Tigri (Centro Ricerche Archeologiche e Scavi di Torino - CRAFT e UniTO).

Negli ultimi dieci anni ha partecipato a diverse spedizioni archeologiche e di tutela del patrimonio nel Vicino Oriente: Dura-Europos (Siria, 2011, CNRS-Paris I), Qal-e Chendar/Shami (Iran, 2013/2016, CRAFT).

È membro del HaSSP (Hatra Salvage Statuary Project - CAMNES), condotto presso il Museo dell'Iraq (Baghdad) nel 2020, con l'obiettivo di restaurare, recuperare e studiare le statue scoperte a Hatra.

La sua ricerca si concentra principalmente sul telerilevamento, gli studi sul paesaggio e la pianificazione urbana antica, utilizzando software GIS.

Enrico Foietta is research fellow and untenured professor for the 'Workshop of Oriental Archaeology – 2023/2024' at the University of Torino (UniTO). He obtained a Phd in archaeology at UniTO in 2017 concerning the city planning and landscape of Hatra (North Iraq). He has received a total of six research fellowships from the University of Turin. He gained in 2018 and 2019/2020 two fellowships in the landscape and town planning of Seleucia on the Tigris (Centro Ricerche Archeologiche e Scavi di Torino - CRAFT and UniTO).

During the last ten years he has participated to several archaeological and heritage expeditions in the Near East: Dura-Europos (Syria, 2011, CNRS-Paris I), Qal-e Chendar/Shami (Iran, 2013/2016, CRAFT).

He is member of the HaSSP (Hatra Salvage Statuary Project - CAMNES) led at the Iraq Museum (Baghdad) in 2020 with the purpose of restoring, recovery and study the statues discovered at Hatra. He focused his main research on remote sensing, landscape studies and ancient city planning using GIS software.
