Paper title - Natural resources and economic development: a critical perspective.



Reviewers' comments (attached to the email above): Natural Resources and Economic Development: A Critical Perspective

The analysis is comprehensive and well structured, as the topic is of great relevance, especially in developing resource-rich regions. Therefore, it is recommended that the manuscript would be accepted for publication.

Minor revision required.

Brief summary

The paper covers an interesting perspective on the so-called “resource-curse” as it examines the benefits and drawbacks of specialising in natural resources resource-rich countries. Specialisation may lead to economic benefits but also structural weaknesses and economic challenges. The authors suggest that, to mitigate these risks, there is the need to address innovation gaps and diversify productive activities, as a crucial step for sustainable development.

Originality/novelty: the manuscript is original and has some novelties related to the topic. Particularly the application of the indicator for natural resources developed and developing countries.

Significance: the results are significant and interpreted appropriately and thus the conclusions are in line with the contents of the article.

Quality of presentation: the article is well written and the English language appropriate. Data and analysis are presented appropriately.

However, we would recommend a table in which are reported the list of the countries took into consideration split between developed and developing countries and the year of the analysis/data.

Scientific soundness: the theoretical approach is well performed, the author/s took into consideration the main theories and authors. **However, it would be appreciated if the author/s will give access to the data and analysis used and made for the readers.**

Interest to the readers: the conclusions are in line with the literature, allowing the author/s to go beyond the state of the art thus giving to the readers the opportunity to get a new insight into the topic. **We would recommend adding on the conclusion some lines related to further investigation (for instance taking into consideration the size of the countries in terms of population and/or extension and their demography (age distribution) and policy recommendations in accordance with the results of the articles.**

Overall merit: as abovementioned the articles will enrich the literature and the readers thus it is important that the journal of Economia Marche will publish it.

Here it follows a brief list of suggestions that should be considered to finalise the manuscript:

- Table of the list of the countries took into consideration as positive and negative examples.
- Furthermore, it might be useful to analyse whether those countries were already advanced economy or not before becoming natural resources' countries. Even in this case, it might be useful to put this aspect on a table with countries and their condition before and after. Furthermore, considering their structures of institutions, education, demography, economy was already advanced or not. Finally, is there a kind of path dependence, in terms of being or not highly structured country before becoming natural resources' countries.

- Line 12, page 2: there should be consistency in the use of UK English across the text (e.g., “specialising” appears sometimes in is US preferred form “specializing”). Please check also other words across the text, such as “labour/labor” at line 29, page 9. This will ensure clarity as it may lead to confusion for the reader.
- Line 3, page 3: acronyms should be explained the first time they appear in order to avoid misunderstandings about the meaning of them. Check FDI in the reported line, and other ones, such as MNC, Line 40, p.8.
- Line 13, page 16: Please assure consistency in the use of the form of composite words, such as “resource based/resource-based”, as it may appear that they have different meanings but actually it is not. Check also for other forms like the one reported.
- Note 7: the formula picture is not well readable.
- Line 31, page 2: comma should be removed as it makes the period reading flow not immediately clear.
- Line 3, page 36: “...tend...” should be put in its singular form “tends”.
- Appendix: figures’ legends are not fully readable.
- Finally, a table or figure to highlight pros and cons of resource abundance can be helpful for the reader.
