Andrea Goldstein has a long career in global governance, currently at the OECD Economics Department in charge of the India/Indonesia/Tunisia desk He was previously Managing Director and Chief Economist at Nomisma; Deputy Director at the UNESCAP Subregional Office for East and North-East Asia in Incheon (Seoul) and at the Heiligendamm L'Aquila Process (the G8-G5 political dialogue) Support Unit; and Senior Economist with the OECD Investment Division and the OECD Development Centre, the World Bank, and the Italian Securities and Exchange Commission.

He has published widely on emerging economies – including <u>L'économie des BRIC</u> (La Découverte 2013) – the strategies of emerging multinationals – including <u>Capitalismo rosso: gli investimenti cinesi in Italia</u> (Egea 2015) and <u>Multinational Companies from Emerging Economies in the Global Economy</u> (Palgrave 2009) – and the impact of the emergence of China and India on other developing countries. Andrea's recent edited books on the Italian economy propose a broad range of reforms to make it more innovative and resilient. He has authored more than 30 articles in refereed journals and also published extensively in newspapers such as the Financial Times, Le Monde, South China Morning Post, China Daily and Il Sole-24 Ore.
