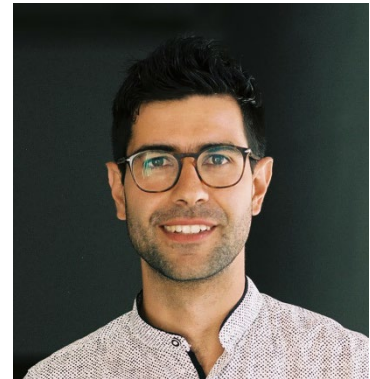

- The project centers on the little-known ‘interweaving’ of communism and feminism in the post-1968 context. Through archival material and interviews, it examines how female activists in three ‘Eurocommunist’ parties – the Italian, Spanish and Brazilian CPs – approached, questioned and eventually converged with feminist debates and repertoires of contestation in the 1970s. It aims to redress both communism history’s androcentric bias and communist women’s absence in feminist genealogies.
