Elisa Gambino is a former LSE Fellow in the International Politics of China in the Department of International Relations at the London School of Economics (LSE).

Elisa's current research focuses on China-Africa relations, with a specific focus on Sino-African economic engagement in the infrastructure and mining sectors. She has recently been interested in the political dynamics characterising the Ghanian construction-mining nexus, with a particular focus on transnational networks amongst Chinese and Ghanaian state and non-state actors.

She previously obtained her PhD in African Studies at the University of Edinburgh as part of the ERC-funded African Governance and Space (<u>AFRIGOS</u>) Project led by Professor Paul Nugent.
