SHORT RESUME

I am an architect and PhD urban planner specialising in urban/rural conservation and development. Since 2016, I have served as Director of Urban Planning and Research Fellow at WHITRAP, a UNESCO Category 2 Research Centre dedicated to urban conservation, in Tongji University, Shanghai, PR China. At WHITRAP, I have conducted a research agenda on the preservation of small settlements and rural areas, collaborating on grassroots projects in villages and acting as a planning consultant for local governments, institutions and NGOs. In addition, I organised conferences, exhibitions, training courses, and publications (scientific papers, reports, conference proceedings, etc.) on the conservation and management of historic areas and World Heritage sites. Before moving to China, I conducted comparative studies on urban conservation in Italy, Latin America and the Middle East (Iran and Iraq) and curated exhibitions and publications on this subject, collaborating with luav University and La Triennale di Milano (2015), Tongji University and UNESCO (2018). In Italy, I worked as an urban planner on post-earthquake reconstruction (L'Aquila 2011) and participated in research programs in the same field (Emilia Region 2013). Prior, I worked as a registered architect (since 2008), focusing mainly on urban renovations, receiving awards for urban contests (Sassuolo 2012, Ancona 2011, Durres 2009).

In 2014, I obtained a doctorate at the Politecnico di Milano, researching post-earthquake reconstruction and sustainable development. I studied architecture at TU Delft and luav University of Venice where I graduated with honours in 2008.

I am a UNESCO expert in urban heritage and *Historic Urban Landscape* and a member of HeritAP-Network of Heritage Practitioners for the Asia and Pacific Region. I participate in the Council of OurWorldHeritage Foundation (OWH) for civil society involvement in World Heritage protection, and I am a member of the editorial board of Built Heritage Journal.
