

Paul F. NEMITZ is the Director for Fundamental rights and Union citizenship in the Directorate-General for Justice of the European Commission. The Free movement of people in Europe, Data protection and Children's rights are also key responsibilities of his Directorate.

Before joining Directorate-General Justice, Nemitz held posts in the Legal Service of the European Commission, the Cabinet of the Commissioner for Development Cooperation and in the Directorates General for Trade,

He obtained a Master of Comparative Law from George Washington University Law School in Washington, D.C., where he was a Fulbright grantee. He also passed the first and second cycle of the Strasburg Faculty for comparative law, supported by a grant of the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD).
