

Domenico is currently the Head of the Unit INTPA/A/1 on the Strategic partnerships with Africa and the Organisation African, Caribbean and Pacific States at the Directorate General for International Partnerships (INTPA) of the European Commission.

The unit is particular in charge of the institutional relations with the Africa Union and of the monitoring of the implementation of the Africa Strategy and the political commitments undertaken by the Heads of State and Government at the African Union – European Union Summits.

In the past year he was also leading the EU Post-Cotonou Task Force and steered the negotiations for the new agreement to be concluded between the EU and the 79 members of the Organisation African, Caribbean and Pacific States upon the expiration of the Cotonou Partnership Agreement in 2020.

Domenico has an extensive experience in external relations of the EU and served as Senior Adviser for Africa in the Cabinet of Commissioner Piebalgs (2012-14) and was previously Member of the Cabinet for Development and Humanitarian Aid of Commissioners Louis Michel and Karel De Gucht (2006-10).

He has a Master degree in Economics and Political Economy (Bocconi University, Milan), in International Politics (ULB, Brussels), and a degree in Psychology (University of Padua, Italy).
