Summary: Judith Olszowy-Schlanger graduated in Hebrew and Oriental Languages at the Institut National des Langues et Civilisations Orientales in Paris in 1991, and obtained her PhD in Cambridge, St. John's College in 1995. After a Junior Research Fellowship in Oxford, Somerville College, she was appointed senior researcher at the Hebrew Section of the Institut de Recherche et d'Histoire des Textes of the CNRS in Paris. In 2002, she was elected to the chair in Hebrew and

Judaeo-Arabic Studies at the Ecole Pratiques des Hautes Etudes, PSL, Paris. In 2018, she became professor in Hebrew and Jewish Studies at Oxford University and a Fellow of Corpus Christi College, and President of the Oxford Centre for Hebrew and Jewish Studies. She holds the title of Chevalier and Officier des Palmes Académiques (French national order bestowed on distinguished academics), and since 2015, she has been a Fellow of the British Academy. Her Chair at the EPHE, Paris, is the unique professorship worldwide dedicated exclusively to Hebrew palaeography and manuscript studies, and therefore it attracts many doctoral candidates. Judith has supervised so far over 20 doctoral students; some of them are now full-fledged established academics.

Her research activities include the study of medieval Hebrew manuscripts as cultural objects, from the point of view of their text, material features including script and the role they played in Jewish intellectual, religious and social life. She is interested in the contacts between Jews and their non-Jewish intellectual environments, especially at the level of book culture. She also studies legal documents in Hebrew characters from different parts of the medieval Jewish world, including Eastern documents discovered in the Cairo Geniza and the contracts in Hebrew from medieval England, France and Germany. She is the head of the international project ‘Books within Books’ Hebrew Fragments in European Libraries (www.hebrewmanuscript.com), run in fourteen countries in Europe, Israel and the USA. The project locates, digitizes, studies and describes the fragments of medieval Hebrew manuscripts reused in the bindings of other books and notarial files in Europe. She is also the creator of a palaeographical method and a digital tool for the study of medieval Hebrew script, Hebrew Palaeography Album (HebrewPal) (<https://www.hebrewpalaeography.com/>). In addition to her research and teaching, she is a member of several learned societies, of the editorial board of several scientific journals, and a scientific advisor of several foundations, of the Jewish Museum of Paris and a member of the scientific advisory board of the City of Paris.

Judith Olszowy-Schlanger is the author or co-author of seven monographs, co-editor of seven volumes of articles and author of over a hundred research papers, and of four online resources.
