The exchange was one of the most valuable academic experiences, giving me new insights and a more critical perspective.

THESIS PROJECTS

Doctoral Thesis in Sociological Demography

My doctoral research project focuses on the effects of labour market and employment uncertainty on fertility behaviour and intentions. I am especially interested in comparing the effects across migrants, children of immigrants and the native (Nordic) population. My research also includes a gender aspect – I am interested in studying how employment uncertainty and unemployment affect the childbearing and family planning of men and women differently depending on their background.

Master's Thesis in Demography

I wrote my master's thesis about the effect of precarious employment on fertility intentions, comparing migrants to the Swedish-born population, using the Swedish GGS-II. The thesis contributes both to the growing research of understanding the effect of subjective perceptions of uncertainty to fertility intentions, and to the field of migrant fertility intentions that have received little attention in academia. I received the highest grade (A) for my thesis, which can be found in this [link](#).

Bachelor's Thesis in Sociology

I wrote my bachelor's thesis on the Finnish discourse of low fertility in the year 2019 when fertility was extremely low, spurring media attention. In the study I analysed the representations and framings of fertility, and the underlying norms, assumptions, power-structures and silences in the dominant fertility discourse in the news using discourse analytical tools. The central findings of the thesis were that despite its plurality, the Finnish fertility discourse was dominantly pronatalist, representing the increase of fertility as a necessity for the national economy, using the rhetoric of concern and fear to support this depiction. A nationalistic concern about the future of the Finnish nation persisted, too - fertility was understood as a public matter, a question of the nation. Furthermore, the discourse was predominantly gendered - women were seen to be responsible for reproduction. I received the highest grade (VG) for my thesis.
