

Marc Lazar, French Professor of Political History and Sociology, is director of the Center for History at Sciences Po (Paris) and President of the School of Government at Luiss University. He is President of the Scientific committee of the Dialogues franco-italiens pour l'Europe, Dialoghi italo-francesi per l'Europa, created by Luiss University and Sciences Po, member of the advisory board of the Scuola nazionale di amministrazione, senior fellow of the Institut Montaigne and senior associate research fellow of ISPI.

His main researchs are on the Left and Far Left in Europe, Politics in Italy, Politics in France, Comparative Politics in France and Italy, Populism, Violence in Politics, Relations between History and Political Science. He published 35 books and more than 230 articles in French, Italian, English, German, Romanian in academical journals. He is member of different boards of academic journal published in French, Italian and English.
