

Alison Duguid was Associate Professor of English Language and Linguistics at the University of Siena in the Department of political, Social and Cognitive studies from 2002 to 2022. She graduated in Linguistics from the University of York and in *Lingue e Letterature Straniere* from the university of Siena and worked in Italy as a language teacher and teacher trainer from 1977, working for the British Council and the Istituto Universitario Orientale in Naples and the University of Siena. Her research interests lie in the field of corpus assisted discourse studies (CADS) and discourse analysis. She has published analysis of a variety of text types: news discourse, including broadcast news, political discourse and opinion pieces. She is interested in lexical priming, in particular forced priming, and evaluation as linguistic phenomena. She is a member of the SiBol group and has written on absence, on public apologies and media evaluations, on evaluation in international tv news channels and on the representations of class in British broadsheets and newspaper informalisation.
