

Prof.dr. **Lutgard Lams** teaches Media Discourse Analysis and Intercultural Communication at the Faculty of Arts of the KU Leuven - Campus Brussels, heads the Brussels Center for Journalism Studies and is chair of the Brussels Center for Chinese Discourse Studies workgroup. Her research focuses on ideology and framing in the media, authoritarian discursive practices, identity politics and nationalism in China/Taiwan/Hong Kong, media discourses in and about the Chinese region, strategic narratives in political communication, and electoral campaign discourses.
