Il Prof. Dr. Richard Higgott, FRSA, FAcSS è un illustre professore di diplomazia presso il Centre for Security, Diplomacy and Strategy (CSDS) della Brussels School of Governance (BSoG-VUB). In una carriera professionale divisa tra Europa e Australia, ora è anche professore ospite di scienze politiche presso l'Università di Siena e professore emerito di economia politica internazionale presso l'Università di Warwick. A Warwick, è stato direttore fondatore del UK Economic and Social Research Council Centre for the Study of Globalisation and Regionalisation e pro-vice cancelliere per la ricerca.

È stato professore di governo presso l'Università di Manchester. In Australia, è stato tra l'altro professore e direttore di studi universitari in affari esteri presso l'Australian National University, Winthrop Professor di scienze politiche presso l'Università dell'Australia Occidentale e direttore dell'Australian Institute of International Affairs, presidente dell'Australasian Political Science Association e vice cancelliere della Murdoch University nell'Australia Occidentale.

È autore/curatore di oltre 20 libri e 130 articoli su importanti riviste, tra cui International Organization, Political Science Quarterly, Review of International Studies, International Political Science Review, Review of International Political Economy, International Affairs, New Political Economy e Global Policy. Ha curato tre importanti riviste peer-reviewed: Australian Journal of International Affairs, Global Governance e, per oltre 20 anni, Pacific Review. Il suo ultimo libro Civilisation, States and the Reset of World Order è stato pubblicato da Routledge nel 2021.

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
