Martin Tironi is an Associate Professor and Director of the School of Design at the Pontifical Catholic University of Chile. He is the director of the Millennium Nucleus for Futures of Artificial Intelligence Research (FAIR). Tironi is a sociologist (Pontifical Catholic University of Chile, 2006), holds a Master's degree in Sociology (Sorbonne V, 2010), and earned a PhD in Sociology from the Centre de Sociologie de l'Innovation, École des Mines de Paris (2013), where he also completed his postdoctoral fellowship (2014). In 2018, he served as a Visiting Professor at the Centre for Invention and Social Process at Goldsmiths, University of London. He is the co-editor of the book *Design For More-Than-Human Futures: Towards Post-Anthropocentric Worlding* (Routledge, 2023). He was also part of the curatorial team that won the gold medal at the London Design Biennale (2021) with the pavilion *Tectonic Resonance: From User-Centered Design to Planet-Oriented Design*.
