

Andrés Malamud es investigador principal en el Instituto de Ciencias Sociales de la Universidad de Lisboa. Licenciado en Ciencia Política por la Universidad de Buenos Aires, obtuvo su doctorado en el Instituto Universitario Europeo (Florencia). Ha sido investigador visitante en el Instituto Max Planck (Heidelberg) y en la Universidad de Maryland (College Park).

Sus intereses de investigación abarcan las instituciones democráticas, la política exterior y los procesos de integración regional. Sus áreas geográficas de especialización son Europa y América Latina. Autor del libro *El oficio más antiguo del mundo. Secretos, mentiras y belleza de la política*, sus trabajos académicos han sido publicados en más de veinte países.

Malamud ha realizado tareas de consultoría para El Diálogo Interamericano, el Banco Interamericano de Desarrollo (BID), el Banco de Desarrollo de América Latina (CAF) y el Parlamento Europeo. Ha integrado el comité ejecutivo de la Asociación Latinoamericana de Ciencia Política (ALACIP) y de la Asociación Portuguesa de Ciencia Política (APCP). Sus columnas de opinión se publican en periódicos de varios países latinoamericanos, España y Portugal.

Andrés Malamud (PhD European University Institute, 2003) is a senior research fellow at the Institute of Social Sciences of the University of Lisbon, where he chaired the PhD program in Comparative Politics. He is a recurring visiting professor at universities in Argentina, Brazil, Italy, and Spain, and spent time as visiting researcher at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law (Heidelberg) and the University of Maryland, College Park. His research interests include comparative regional integration, foreign policy, democracy and political institutions, EU Studies, and Latin American politics. His work has been published in six languages and over twenty countries in such journals as *Political Studies*, *Social Science Quarterly*, *Regional & Federal Studies*, *Latin American Research Review*, *Latin American Politics and Society*, *Latin American Perspectives*, *Cambridge Review of International Affairs*, *Journal of European Integration*, and *European Political Science*. Malamud served in the executive committee of the Latin American Political Science Association (ALACIP) and as official representative to the European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR), and he was vice-president and secretary-general of the Portuguese Political Science Association (APCP). He has worked as a consultant for the Washington DC-based Inter-American Dialogue and for the European Parliament, and has been a member of the advisory boards of the EU-LAC Foundation, Sciences Po's OPALC, Brussels-based EUBrasil Association, and CAF's European academic network. Malamud contributes regular political comment to newspapers in Latin America and Europe.
