Tronto is mentioned twice in Kim, H. J. and B. Grofman (2019). "The Political Science 400: With Citation Counts by Cohort, Gender, and Subfield." *PS: Political Science & Politics* 52(2): 296-311; she was listed among the top 25 active political theorists and among the top 40 women political scientists in all fields.

Tronto's h index, reported by google, is 45 (March 13 2024).

Tronto received the Benjamin E. Lippincott Award from the American Political Science Association in 2023; "to recognize a work of exceptional quality by a living political theorist that is still considered significant after a time span of at least 15 years since the original date of publication."
