PhD in Architecture from the National Autonomous University of Mexico, assigned to the Center for Research in Architecture, Urbanism, and Landscape of the School of Architecture. His research focuses on 20th-century Housing, Construction history, and Conservation of Modern Architecture.

He is a full-time tenured professor at the School of Architecture. He lectures on “The history of Housing in Mexico” at undergraduate level and “Architecture of the 2nd Modernity, 1940-1990” at master’s level. He belongs to the National System of Researchers. He was editor-in-chief of the research journal of the School of Architecture at UNAM, *Academia XXII*, from 2022 to 2024.

He is the author of the book *La otra vivienda colectiva moderna en México*, 2019 (The Other Modern Collective Housing in Mexico); co-author of the book *Historia del Barrio Universitario Moderno en el Pedregal*, 2022 (History of the Modern University Neighborhood in El Pedregal), and co-coordinator of the books *Arquitectura y suburbios: en busca de la periferia. Entornos del Movimiento Moderno en México*, 2024 (Architecture and Suburbs: In Search of the Periphery. Environments of the Modern Movement in Mexico) and *Arquitectura y ciudad del Movimiento Moderno en México*, 2020 (Architecture and City of the Modern Movement in Mexico). He has also written twelve chapters and twenty-three research articles.
