Back to the Roots: Language, Capitalism, and Rural Utopias in Contemporary Italy

This project furthers the understanding of rural revivals in Italy and beyond through a new focus on the poetic (i.e. world-making) role of language in envisioning utopian alternatives to global capitalism. On the basis of audiovisual and ethnographic data collected by participating in the lives of hobby-farmers, neo-rural entrepreneurs, and food activists, my monograph-in-progress argues that neo-rurality is an existential and political project that draws on creative linguistic and semiotic practices as a way to respond to the ongoing standardization of both agricultural labor and human interaction.
