Quantitatively oriented sociologist specializing in migration, social stratification, and education. My research examines how spatial mobility intersects with social mobility and inequality, with additional interests in digital divides in later life and second-chance education. I employ a broad range of econometric techniques—including structural equations, multilevel and panel data modeling, sequence analysis, and causal research designs—drawing on cross-national surveys (e.g., SHARE, EU-LFS, ETEFIL, ESD 1991) and administrative data from national registers.
