Research themes include educational stratification and tracking, school-to-work transitions, job typology and quality, income inequality, and positional mobility across income deciles.

Research activities for the project, *"Three levers for tackling the ageing of the population: young people, gender, and migration"*, aimed to assess the impact of increased labour market participation on the ageing of the Italian population. The project focused on enhancing the untapped potential of youth, women, and migrants. Produced three quantitative reports analysing:

- *Youth and the "delay syndrome"*: Examined the fragmented transition to adulthood among Italian youth, focusing on education-to-work pathways, early school leaving, NEET rates, and the effects of familism and intergenerational inequality on social mobility.
- *Women and the labour market*: Analysed female labour market participation and gender inequalities in Italy and Europe, exploring the effects of part-time employment, fertility patterns, and welfare policies on work–family reconciliation and well-being.
- *Migration and geographic mobility*: Studied migration flows to Italy and the role of foreign workers in sustaining employment through 2050, analysing workforce composition by skill, gender, and education.

Across all reports, population and employment projections were developed based on macroeconomic data from Eurostat, Istat, OECD, the Wittgenstein Centre Human Capital Data Explorer, and the UN World Population Prospects.
