He teaches at FICLIT (UNIBO) and SAPD (ASMO). He has been involved in research, teaching, and communication for the MCAA of the Comune di Bologna and has served as Scientific Director of Rocchetta Mattei (CARISBO) and the Museo della Città di Livorno. After an initial position at SABAP-COLC, he returned to the “Ministero della Cultura” (MiC) at the newly established “Ville e Residenze Monumentali Fiorentine”.

A member of the “Società Internazionale di Storia della Miniatura”, he has participated in international conferences, exhibitions, and research projects, including collaborations with the Università di Bucarest and the Istituto Italiano di Cultura, as well as with UNICATT in Prague. His experience spans from the J. Paul Getty Museum and UCLA in Los Angeles, and the projects in the Holy Land and Malta. He has also collaborated on numerous TV productions, contributing to the making of documentaries for RAI, SKY, and others.
